Gentle Reminders



Near Misses with School Children on Train Tracks



There have been some near misses recently involving children crossing train tracks before and after school. They all have one thing in common: **children aren't expecting a "second train"**. In all of these recent near misses, bells and lights have still been operating, but because the first train has passed, students make the mistake of thinking it's safe to cross. This can be extremely dangerous as the track crossings in areas with double tracks **always** have the potential for a second train to pass. This link shows footage of one near miss:

As well as looking and listening before crossing, please make it clear to children that if bells and lights are going, it's because a second train could be coming and it's not safe to cross.
