Please Keep our Children Safe!

A reminder to parents about safe and careful driving around the school. The Rimu Street entrance is a terrible place for pick ups and drop offs. Many parents have come to me having seen some of the most dangerous driving by some parents and caregivers in our community. I am seriously concerned that people are putting our children at risk of being injured or worse. Please take the time to park in a safe place and walk to the school gate so that we keep our children safe!

The well-being of our community: It is important that teachers are looking after themselves before and after school hours. Teachers have meetings on Monday and Tuesday afternoons starting at 3.15-4.30pm and Thursday mornings from 8am-8.30am. On Wednesdays senior teachers have mentoring sessions with new teachers from 3.30-4.30pm.

The leadership team encourage teachers to respond to emails, texts and phone calls before 5.30pm. After this time, it is important our teaching team is spending quality time with family and friends.

Little tools like this will keep our staff energised for teaching and learning programmes that we provide at school. The senior leadership are continuing to focus on the wellbeing of our staff.

Health : If you are concerned about your child's health, we have a community nurse, Ioana Gaulofo, who would be glad to help. Get in touch with the office and we will forward your details to her.

Handwashing: With all of the winter bugs going around, please remind your children to wash their hands before eating and try to avoid touching their eyes, noses and mouths. Coughs and sneezes should be caught in a sleeve or tissue, not in hands. Hands should also be washed after nose blowing. Any students who have a tummy bug (daiarrhoea and/or vomiting) must stay home for 48 hours after the last episode.

Absences: Thank you to all of you who have been so good at keeping us in the loop about your child/ren's absence. Please contact the office to report your child's absence every day that they are away. If your child is going to be late, a courtesy call is much appreciated.


