School Accounts—An update on your balances were sent home last week. Thank you to parents who have been paying off their school accounts—bit by bit—your payments have made such a difference and we appreciate your support and generosity with voluntary school donations, and other requested payments. Lateness to School - just a wee calculation—if a child is late to school by 15 minutes each day . . .that equates to 50 hours per year . . .that equates to two weeks off school every year!

EXCITING ANNOUNCEMENT – HOT OFF THE PRESS!!

Trial Reo Classes: In response to the aspirations of our Maori whanau and wider community we are excited to share that we have created an opportunity for some of our senior students to participate in Reo Maori (Maori Language) classes. We recently welcomed Mairangimoana to join the HHS teaching team and Mairangi brings with her expertise in kapa haka, reo and all things Maori, so we are pleased to start a trial of reo classes in the hope we will be able to grow these in future. **So, on Monday's afternoons you will find her working in Runga Staffroom with a small number of students, with the support of Whaea Kelly and Jo.**

The purpose of these classes is to;

Grow capable and confident leaders of Te Ao Maori through use of te reo (a.k.a Reo Warriors). These learners will be encouraged to take their learning back to their classes and to inspire greater use of te reo Maori at Hampton Hill School, and hopefully beyond.

What will this look like?

Students will learn to...

- Model using te reo maori in and around the school, and in the classroom
- Model using correct pronunciation when speaking te reo
- Share their pepeha confidently in different contexts
- Teach others - correct pronunciation, meaning behind karakia, waiata, kawa and tikanga
- Lead karakia and waiata in the class and across the school

Explicitly lead/teach teachers/students correct pronunciation of te reo maori where needed

What will be involved in the learning programme?

Karakia; Waiata; Whakatauki; Whakapapa/Pepeha; Kupu Maori (focussing on everyday language); Simple sentence structures; Using language in contexts (sports, the arts, compliments, commands, questioning etc); Creating resources/challenges for HHS

At this stage spaces are (sadly!) limited, (we are testing the waters out with sixteen students), but our long term goal is to grow this kaupapa to thrive - **so that all students will be a part of this important learning. Also, part of Mairangi's mahi will be to support the kaiako (teachers) and wider kura (school) to develop deeper on our journey with Te Ao Maori (the Maori world – all things Maori) – we don't want anyone to miss out!**

Tui: **Amos** for being a great story teller, **Michal** - what wonderful writing using interesting words, **Teina**- for always showing manaakitanga.


