Kia ora koutou,

We have made a lovely start back to school at Hampton Hill over the past few days. Our children seem excited to be back after a restful break and are enjoying being amongst their friends as they start their learning.

I wanted to let you know that this year we have officially joined **the Ministry of Education's Positive Behaviour for Learning - School-Wide (PB4L-SW)** programme. PB4L-SW is an evidence-based framework for implementation that looks at behaviour and learning from a whole-of-school as well as an individual student perspective.

It provides schools with a process for teaching social and behavioural skills and helps them to develop a positive, proactive, and systematic approach based on school data. It takes the approach that opportunities for learning and achievement increase if:

- The school environment is positive and supportive
- Expectations are consistently clear
- Students are consistently taught expected behaviours
- Expected behaviours are consistently acknowledged
- Inappropriate behaviours are consistently responded to in a fair and equitable way

Our work with the ministry regarding this programme starts later in the term. The entire programme is a 3-5 year process with various tiers in place to accomplish. We will keep you updated on our progress and will reach out for consultation at times. 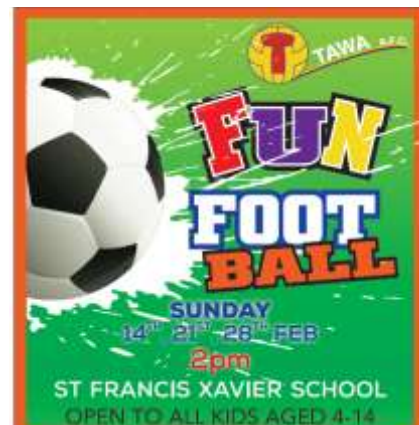
